Hebrews 6:13-20

1. What do you feel is the thing most changed in our American society today from when you were a child?
2. Do you like change or hate it? Why?
3. What is so significant about God never changing? How does this make you feel?
4. What prevents God from changing?
5. Of the several verses mentioned about God not changing, which one impacts you the most? Why?
6. The Bible uses rock for a metaphor for God's immutability. Why would a rock be chosen to represent this? What metaphor would you use? Why?
7. How does the fact God's promises never change affect your ability to trust Him?
8. Abraham still believed God would keep His promise even when it became physically impossible. What kept Abraham believing in God's promise at this point and not giving in to believing God would not keep His promise?
9. Are you holding on to a promise or are you starting to wonder?
10. How does Abraham's story of faith and kept promises strengthen your faith in God? Explain.
11. God asking Abraham to slay Isaac may seem like God was going against His purpose. How did this request actually start the fulfillment of God's purpose?
12. Give an example from your life where God was doing something that at first seemed like it was counter-intuitive? How did God accomplish His purpose through this situation?
13. How do we react to people who have major mood swings or fickle emotions?

14. How does God being constant in His feelings and mood encourage us to approach Him with the problems, needs, and joys of life? Do you think you would be as willing to go to Him if He were fickle? Why or why not?
15. Why is it important for God's laws and Word not to change? Is it easy to believe in something that doesn't change when society changes so easily? Why or why not?
16. How does God's immutability allow us to change?
17. What in your life needs to be changed? What is the item you say "that's just who I am."
18. Why does our soul need an anchor?
19. How does having Jesus as our anchor in heaven keep us on track and pull us toward change?
20. How does God change us? What are some things He uses to change us?
21. Why does the world hate the fact God doesn't change? Why would they want Him to change? If God were to change, would He still be God?
22. Is it enough to be a believer of Jesus Christ? Why or why not? Why must we be a disciple as well?
23. Which are you: just a believer or are you a disciple as well?
